### **Bountiful Blessings...**



Community members gathered at the Growing Hope field on October 14, to celebrate the program's sixth annual harvest as it was being gathered. It took just half an hour for the six combines to bring in the 31 acres of soybeans from the ground at the corner of 50 South and 500 West. This crop was far from a certainty, as the wet spring pushed back

planting, and there was concern about the quality of the beans. In the end, after much prayer and trust in God's faithfulness, Boone County farmers, in collaboration with the Boone County Farm Bureau, presented a gift of more than \$19,000 to Love INC, to help this ministry serve local neighbors in need.



Many thanks to all who attended, and to the program committee for organizing the planting and harvesting of the crop, as well as providing the meal at the celebration. By using your God-given skills and talents, you are truly making an eternal difference in this community!

The Living Hope Planning Committee is busy! Since sharing information about this exciting new ministry opportunity at the banquet, much work is being done to make the dream a reality.

**Meetings with church leaders are taking place,** as Love INC provides them with information about the program and the vital part they could play in solving the problem of homelessness in Boone County. Dover Christian Church is the first church to officially come on board!!

**Connections with community agencies are being made**, with an agency proposing a potential partnership to provide housing for participants in the Living Hope program.

The committee has contracted with Schott Design to develop plans for the renovation of the warehouse at Love INC into a Day Center. The plans will soon be finalized, and the next phase of obtaining bids will begin.

## **Transformational Ministry Classes**

Affirming Potential, the first class offered through our Loving Hope (Transformation Ministry) program, just wrapped up recently. This class encourages those attending to recognize that each individual is created with a God-given purpose and capacity. Attendees are encouraged to dream about their future and to develop those dreams into goals with action steps. Peppered with Scripture, the course emphasizes looking at the life through the lens of God's hope. At each of the seven sessions, 8-13 individuals were in attendance. Churches that blessed the group with delicious meals were: Advance Christian Church, Dover Christian Church, Freedom Church, Jamestown United Methodist Church, Lebanon Christian Church, Pleasant View Church, and



Zionsville United Methodist Church. Additionally, incentive items were provided by Western Boone FCA, Mechanicsburg Christian Church, and New Hope Christian Church. Teachers Dean DeVries, Mark King, and Boni Hype encouraged those attending. A big thanks goes out to amazing church hosts: Lebanon Christian Church and Jamestown United Methodist Church.

The second class offering of Loving Hope is in partnership with Purdue Extension. The class, taught by Lisa Canagy of Purdue Extension, is entitled, Where Does Your Money Go? This is a two-session class that utilizes some engaging activities that encourage those attending to really analyze their spending habits. Each session is followed with a faith-based, financial devotional.

January will begin with Money Management—God's Plan for Making "Cents" of Finances. This class will feature topics like checking and savings accounts, budgeting, and shopping wisely. Mike Holdmann and Tom and Denise Schoeff will be teaching this course, which is slated to begin on January 15 and run for 8 weeks.

March 11, a class based on the book, "Boundaries," by Cloud and Townsend will begin. This class will be taught by Boni Hype. This class gives great insight on how to set healthy boundaries for relationships and responsibilities of life. This class will run 4-5 weeks.

In order to honor the time that each of our neighbors commits to these classes, Love INC arranges for churches to provide a meal before each class and incentive items for the neighbors to take home each week. The items that are given are items that cannot be purchased with SNAP food cards, but are needed by all families. Examples of these items are trash bags, toilet paper, shampoo, and detergent.
